### **Advisory # 3 TROPICAL STORM WATCH FOR ST VINCENT AND THE GRENADINES (SVG)**

Issued at 12:00 noon, Thursday June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023

#### **A Tropical Storm Watch remains in effect for SVG for Tropical Storm Bret**

A Tropical Storm Watch is issued when sustained winds of 39 – 73 mph (63 – 118kmh) associated with a tropical storm is possible, in this case within the next 24 hours.

At 11 am, the center of the Tropical Storm Bret was located near latitude 13.8° North; longitude 57.7° West, or approximately 230 miles (370 kilometers) east of the SVG. The system is moving towards the west at 14 mph (23 km/h) with maximum sustained winds of 70 mph (110 km/h) with higher gusts.

The center of Bret and its strongest winds are expected to pass well north of SVG tonight June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2023. However, strong winds gusting possibly to storm force are likely during this period.

#### **A Flash Flood Watch will be in effect from 12:00 noon 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2023**

Outer bands of Tropical Storm Bret will begin to affect SVG today with showers, periods of rain, isolated thunderstorms and strong gusty winds. Rainfall accumulations of 3 to 6 inches (75 to 150mm) with isolated higher amounts are likely across the islands. A flash-flood is in effect from 12 noon today June 22<sup>nd</sup> 2023 until further notice. **Residents and motorists in areas prone to flooding and landslides or near rivers and streams should be prepared**

#### **A small-Craft and High Surf Advisory is in effect from 12:00 noon 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 2023**

Marine conditions will deteriorate today with moderate to rough sea swells of 2.5m to 3.5m (8 ft to 11ft). As a result, a small craft and high surf advisory is in effect from 12 noon today June 22<sup>nd</sup> 2023 until further notice. Consequently, **only vessels capable of withstanding these swells should venture out. Small craft should remain in port. Sea-bathers are also advised to stay out of the water.**
