Weather Discussion:

South easterly winds will draw equatorial moisture to our islands within this forecast period, therefore, partly cloudy to cloudy conditions are anticipated. Showers, some of which could be moderate at times will be sporadic in nature as the upper levels provide support into Sunday. Breezy conditions will also persist within the next two days, agitating sea conditions.

Moderate to fresh (~20 to 35km/h) east south-easterly trades are currently crossing our islands with occasional gusts. An increase (~40 km/h) in speed is expected on Saturday, whereas speeds should decrease (~15-25kmh) along Monday. Seas are moderate in open water with swells ranging between 1.5m to 2.0m and increasing. **Small craft operators and sea bathers should exercise caution for above normal sea swells.** Sea conditions should improve on Monday. In addition, Saharan dust haze concentrations may further increase on Saturday, reducing visibility and air quality across our islands.

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
