Weather Discussion:

Pockets of showers, strong winds and possible isolated thunderstorms are forecast across Saturday afternoon as a wave exits the Eastern Caribbean. Residents and motorists in areas prone to flash flooding and landslides or near rivers and streams should remain alert. In addition, a high wind advisory remains in effect until 6pm, therefore, residents are strongly urged to be vigilant against falling trees limbs, loose outdoor objects and disconnected overhead wires. Saharan dust haze concentrations will be noticeable up to Sunday. Take precautions. A few shallow moisture patches will allow for some passing showers on Monday before an approaching tropical wave affects our islands around Tuesday.

Near gale (~50 km/h) south easterly to easterly trades are crossing our islands, slightly decreasing (~45 km/h) by nightfall. A significant decrease (10-25 km/h) in wind speeds is expected on Tuesday. Seas are moderate to rough in open water with swells peaking near 1.8 m on western coasts and near 2.8 m on eastern coasts. A small craft advisory remains in effect for SVG. Only vessels capable of withstanding these swell magnitudes should venture out. Sea-bathers are advised to stay out of the water. Moderate sea swells are expected on Sunday, however an improvement to the marine conditions are anticipated from Tuesday.
