Weather Discussion:

A weak shearline will begin to affect the islands tonight, increasing the chance of isolated showers and thunderstorms. Instability from the shearline is forecast to linger into Sunday morning, before a tropical wave begins to affect the islands. Mid-levels will be relatively dry and a few scattered showers with a slight chance of thunderstorms is forecast for Sunday. The days and nights will continue to be warm and slight haze intrusion is forecast from Sunday.

An unstable atmosphere on Monday could result in scattered showers and possible thunderstorms.

Patches of low level clouds traversing the islands on Tuesday will result in a few occasional scattered showers under fair to partly cloudy skies.

Winds will blow from the E-ENE at 9mph – 10mph (15km/h-25km/h). Seas are forecast to be smooth to moderate in open waters with swells ranging between 0.5m-1.0m on the western coasts, and 1.0m-2.0m on the eastern coasts.

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
