Weather Discussion:

A tropical wave is approaching the Eastern Caribbean and should begin to affect our islands late Friday into Saturday. Models suggests that a favourable upper level environment is expected to be in place during its passage. Instability trailing the wave could trigger light to heavy showers and isolated thunderstorms during Sunday. **Residents and motorists in areas prone to flooding and landslides or near rivers and streams should exercise caution.** In addition, Saharan dust concentrations should thin out across Saturday but a moderate to thick plume should return on Sunday, reducing visibility and air quality. **Residents should take the necessary precautions.**

East northeasterly to easterly trades ranging from 25 to 45 km/h (19 to 28 mph) are expected during the forecast period. As a result, moderate sea conditions are forecast, with swell heights near 1.5m (5ft) west of our islands and ranging from 2.0m (7ft) to 2.4m (8ft) east of our islands. **Small craft operators and sea bathers should exercise caution for above normal sea swells and occasional gusty winds.**
