SMALL-CRAFT ADVISORY for ST. VINCENT and the GRENADINES

Issued at 6pm, Tuesday 7th July, 2026

A tropical wave is expected to cross the islands during Wednesday night and conditions could support cloudy skies, gusty winds, moderate-heavy showers and thunderstorm activity across St. Vincent and the Grenadines (SVG) from Wednesday evening until Thursday morning.

Moderate-fresh (25 - 35km/h) breeze could increase with gusty (35 - 45km/h) conditions during Wednesday night.

Sea conditions are expected to be moderate-rough during Wednesday night and early Thursday, with swells ranging 1.5m (5ft) to 1.8m (6ft) west of our islands and 2.5m (8ft) to 3.0m(10ft) east of our islands.

Conditions could become unsafe for small-craft operators and sea-bathers, particularly on the northern and eastern coastlines. Sea-bathers are advised to stay out of the water.

These conditions may be more adverse at times of high-tide.

High-tide times:

Wednesday: 12:23pm and 11:57pm and Thursday: 01:01pm

A Small-Craft Advisory is issued when sustained winds of 37 to 46 km/h (23 to 29 mph) (20 to 25kts) and/or sea swells of 2.5 to 3.0 meters (8 to 10 feet) are affecting or forecast to affect the marine area within the next 36 hours.

Therefore, a Small-craft Advisory would be in effect for St Vincent and the Grenadines and its coastal waters from 12noon Wednesday 8th July 2026 until 12noon Thursday 9th July 2026.

This advisory may be extended or discontinued sooner if conditions warrant.
