WEATHER INFORMATION STATEMENT #2

Issued: 7:00 pm Tuesday, 11th August, 2026.

UPDATE: An approaching tropical wave that previously had with a low chance of tropical cyclone formation has seen its chances of development dropped to 0%. Nevertheless, strong wind speeds are anticipated across our area on Thursday and Friday which will result in deteriorating marine conditions. The chance of showers increases by Wednesday evening. Additional updates will be provided in the upcoming days.

Meanwhile, the St. Vincent and the Grenadines Meteorological Services continues to monitor an area of disorganized showers and thunderstorms associated with a tropical wave occurring around 550 miles southwest of the Cabo Verde Islands at 2pm today. Environmental conditions are forecast to become more favourable for development during the next couple of days, and a tropical depression will likely form later this week while the system moves westward to west-northwestward across the central tropical Atlantic. There is now a **high** (70%) chance that this feature could form into a tropical cyclone during the next 7 days.

Current model guidance suggests that the system should track north of our islands but could still trigger some pockets of moderate showers and possible isolated thunderstorms across SVG around Sunday.
