RSVGPF PROVIDES UPDATE FOLLOWING FATAL GREEN HILL SHOOTING

September 26, 2026 – Kingstown: The Royal Saint Vincent and the Grenadines Police Force (RSVGPF) is investigating a shooting incident in the Green Hill community in Central Kingstown which left four persons dead and four others injured on Friday night.

At approximately 10:30 p.m. on September 25, 2026, police responded to reports of gunfire in the community.

On arrival, officers discovered two bodies lying on the public road. The body of a female was found inside a vehicle parked along the roadway, while another body was discovered on an adjacent piece of land. All four persons appeared to have sustained gunshot injuries.

Four other persons who sustained gunshot injuries were transported to the Milton Cato Memorial Hospital for medical attention. Two were subsequently treated and discharged, while two remain hospitalised.

The identities of the deceased are being withheld at this time in the interest of the ongoing investigation and related security considerations. Further information will be released when appropriate.

During a press conference held on Saturday, September 26, 2026, the Commissioner of Police (Ag.) Mr. Trevor Bailey expressed condolences to the families and loved ones of those who lost their lives and conveyed concern for those injured.

Police also observed markings on structures within the immediate vicinity of the scene. Those markings are being considered as part of the investigation. No further details concerning them are being disclosed at this stage.

The Commissioner appealed particularly to young people to reject crime and violence, noting the impact that gun violence has on families and otherwise peaceful communities.

“Violence has no part in our society. It brings pain. It brings discomfort to families.”

Persons who may have witnessed suspicious activity or who possess relevant video footage, photographs or other information are particularly encouraged to come forward.

Members of the public are also urged to avoid circulating speculation or unverified information while the investigation remains active.

Investigations are continuing.

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
